Vaccination saves lives

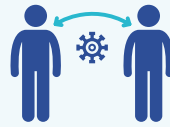
Protection from measles



Cases of measles are rising across the UK.



Measles is very infectious and can be very serious.



It spreads easily between people who are not vaccinated.



It can cause serious illnesses such as meningitis.



People, including children, can die from measles.



The best protection is two doses of a vaccine that protects against measles.



Vaccination against measles is free.



The MMR vaccine protects against mumps and rubella, as well as measles.

Our records show that **you/your child** has not had two doses of an MMR-containing vaccine.
